In the midst of lock-down anxiety and loneliness, Friends and volunteers came together for monthly "socials" via Zoom. The socials provided a means to travel virtually to Antarctica, Africa and Iceland, facilitated by stunning photography and scientific discussion by the presenters. Subsequent socials included a fun trivia night, a presentation on the Rapp Road Historical District recounting the "Great Migration" of African Americans to Albany; a book presentation by the author of Exploring the Palantine and its Albany Pine Bush connection; and finally, a virtual tour of the Discovery Center Gift Shop just in time for Christmas!

Friends and volunteers have participated in every-other-month work sessions at the Northeast Regional Food Bank supporting their mission to keep the shelves of local food pantries stocked and food available to those in need.

The unequal effects of the pandemic brought diversity and inclusion to the fore and the Friends developed a Diversity and Inclusion Statement to guide us and which is now accessible on every monthly <u>news and upcoming events</u> enewsletter. The Friends responded to the pent up need to "get outdoors" in 2020, by encouraging participation in the 12/20 Challenge (12 unique trails totaling 20 miles). Brochures were made available, along with the trail maps, at trail kiosks and hikers can claim a completion sticker upon submission of their recorded hikes.

The Friends continued co-sponsoring the monthly Science Lectures, (for now virtually) on topics ranging from Restoration of the Pine Barrens through the use of prescribed burnsto recovery efforts to save the endangered Karner Blue butterfly. At the close of 2020, Pine Bush Perspectives from previous years were displayed at Uncommon Grounds Coffee & Bagels in Albany for visitors to glimpse at the beauty of the Pine Bush we all love, through the eyes of talented photographers.

Mission of the Friends

The Friends of the Pine Bush Community is committed to working with the Albany Pine Bush Commission to provide support and opportunities for the public to participate in activities that contribute to stewardship and appreciation of the unique natural communities found in the Albany Pine Bush Preserve.

Highlights of 2020

- Released a statement of *Diversity and Inclusion and set a direction toward making programs and trails more welcoming to our region's diverse communities.*
- Supported a Cultural Resource Geodatabase, mapping project that will help the Albany Pine Bush staff recognize important archeological remnants that need protecting prior to any tree removal or soil disturbance in the future. A campaign to provide information about the project to Friends and then finance the project, was very successful.
- Started Social Hours via Zoom in response to the need to keep connected with Friends.
- Supported a social-distanced Discover the Night program with staff and special guests featured on videos showing local wildlife and providing storytelling, in-person night-hiking, interactive games, nature craft instruction and other activities. Kits were made available to participating youth and were also supplied to the pediatric unit at Albany Medical Center.
- Co-sponsored the 7th annual Pine Bush Perspectives, a juried photo exhibit of nature photographs taken within the Pine Bush Preserve, providing awards to the winners. Friends funded the purchase of weather-proof prints to be displayed along trail behind Discovery Center. Also, a travelling show displayed at local libraries and café featuring the "best of" from previous years of the Pine Bush Perspectives.
- Temporarily paused Ticket to Ride, a popular program that pays for the transportation of children from schools and youth groups to the Discovery Center. It is very much alive, just on hold due to the pandemic. In response to the need from staff to provide schools with live virtual programs, Friends funded the purchase of cellular capable iPad Pro and tripod equipment along with data plan enabling live streaming.
- Supported the purchase of scientific instrumentation for use by staff scientists and volunteers involved with citizen science projects, including snowpack monitoring equipment.
- Continued support for monthly Science Lecture Series, via zoom and webinar.
- Expanded the scope of the 12/20 Challenge making brochures more accessible at trailheads and providing a small prize for those completing the hiking challenge.
- Coordinated with the Northeast Regional Food Bank so Friends could volunteer as a group, every-othermonth sorting and packing fresh produce and other food for distribution to food pantries.
- Continued ability for Friends to direct their on-line purchases to benefit the Friends, through *Amazon Smile*.
